Re: City Administrator's Report to Council

1. Street Improvement Program: Hardrock Concrete has opened up the west side of Rosedale Boulevard from Moore Road to Wick Road, including the driveway approaches. They are preparing to pour concrete early next week on the west side of Park Avenue from Champaign Road to Angelique Avenue. Hardrock Concrete's subcontractor for underground work, DeAngelo Brothers, has completed the storm sewer pipe installation on Philomene Boulevard from Park Avenue to Colwell Avenue.
2. Concrete Sectioning Program: Savone Cement continues to work on the Wick Road straight-a-ways from Laurence Avenue to Fox Avenue. Work will soon continue from Fox Avenue to Rosedale Boulevard.
3. Water Main Replacement: The Contractor for the Winona Avenue (Champaign Road to Ecorse Road) project, Bricco Excavating, has been delayed with obtaining some of the parts for this project. They are scheduled to have pipe delivered early next week and should start the project shortly thereafter.
4. The Fire Department's ISO (Insurance Services Office) Rating has improved from a 5 to a 4. This review is done every five (5) years by ISO. The ISO Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS) evaluates four (4) primary categories of fire suppression — fire department, emergency communications, water supply,

and community risk reduction. The FSRS includes standards set by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). Business and residential fire insurance rates are largely determined by this rating.

5. The Fire Department is planning to host their 2022 Open House on Sunday, October 9th from 12:00 to 3:00 PM.
6. The Downriver Community Conference Brownfield Consortium approved the Assessment Grant Application to conduct a Phase I Environmental Assessment at 6834 Park Avenue.
7. The following employee will reach a milestone in years of service with the City –
 - Steven Segrest (Police Department) – 15 Years – August 20th
8. Congratulations to Chief Chris Egan for being accepted to the 284th Session of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

The FBI National Academy is a professional course of study for U.S. and International law enforcement managers nominated by their agency heads because of demonstrated leadership qualities. Participation is by invitation-only through a nomination process.

The 10-week program – which provides coursework in intelligence theory, terrorism and terrorist mindsets, management science, law, behavioral science, law enforcement communication, and forensic science – serves to improve the administration of justice in police departments and agencies at home and abroad and to raise law enforcement standards, knowledge, and cooperation worldwide.

Course of Study Sessions include approximately 265 officers (including up to 35 international students), who take undergraduate and/or graduate courses at the FBI Academy campus. Classes are offered in a diverse set of areas, and officers participate in a wide range of leadership and specialized trainings. Officers share

ideas, techniques, and experiences with each other and create lifelong partnerships that transcend state and national borders.

The Yellow Brick Road is the final test of the fitness challenge – a grueling 6.1-mile run through a hilly, wooded trail built by the U.S. Marines. Along the way, the participants must climb over walls, run through creeks, jump through simulated windows, scale rock faces with ropes, crawl under barbed wire in muddy water, maneuver across a cargo net, and more. When (and if) the students complete this difficult test, they receive an actual yellow brick to memorialize their achievement.
