## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- After an observational study was published in the medical journal The Lancet on Friday, the World Health Organization (WHO) has temporarily halted studying hydroxychloroquine as a potential COVID-19 treatment in its Solidarity Trial due to findings that seriously ill COVID-19 patients were more likely to die if treated with hydroxychloroquine and chloroquine.
- United Auto Workers (UAW) has filed a grievance against Ford after 2 (two) Ford employees tested positive for COVID-19 last week, forcing 20 other employees to quarantine. UAW believes the plants reopened too soon and a UAW representative is demanding Ford shutdown its Dearborn truck plant until it starts full and regular testing employees for COVID-19.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following COVID-19-related Executive Orders:
  - [2020-99](#): Extending the state of emergency declaration related to the COVID-19 pandemic until June 19, 2020.
  - [2020-100](#): Extending the Michigan's Safer at Home order until June 12, 2020. This will extend the temporary closure of certain places of public accommodation such as theaters, gyms, and casinos.
  - [2020-101](#): Extending the validity of watercraft registrations that expired after February 1, 2020 to July 31, 2020.
  - [2020-102](#): Extends the temporary suspension of Michigan's Reid Vapor Pressure standards and permits the transportation and sale of gasolines with a higher Reid vapor pressure across the state.
  - [2020-103](#): Allows local governments to use alternative means, other than mass mailings, to send out hearing notifications.
- Governor Gretchen Whitmer has announced a temporary, \$2-per-hour pay raise for direct care workers providing Medicaid-funded in-home behavioral health and long-term care services to Michigan's most vulnerable residents during the continuing COVID-19 pandemic.
