SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- In **Wayne County, Michigan**, community level is **Low**.
- Wayne County dashboard may be found at www.waynecounty.com/COVID19dashboard for latest community updates.
- Wash your hands often. Use soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If you do not have soap and water, use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. —**CDC**
- COVID-19 vaccine boosters can further enhance or restore protection that might have decreased over time after your primary series vaccination. —**CDC**
- New variants of a virus happen because the virus that causes COVID-19 constantly changes through a natural ongoing process of mutation (change). As the virus spreads, it has more opportunities to change. High vaccination coverage in a population reduces the spread of the virus and helps prevent new variants from emerging. —**CDC**
- You are considered up-to-date if you have completed your primary series but are not yet eligible for a booster. You have received 1 booster but are not recommended to get a 2nd booster. You have received 1 booster but are not yet eligible for a 2nd booster. —**CDC**
- Exact vaccine ingredients vary by manufacturer. Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines also contain messenger RNA (mRNA) and the Johnson & Johnson/Janssen COVID-19 vaccine contains a harmless version of a virus unrelated to the virus that causes COVID-19. These give instructions to cells in your body to create an immune response. This response helps protect you from getting sick with COVID-19 in the future. After the body produces an immune response, it discards all the vaccine ingredients just as it would discard any information that cells no longer need. This process is a part of normal body functioning. —**CDC**
- If you test positive for COVID-19 or if you have been exposed it is important that you immediately take steps to get the care you need and avoid giving COVID-19 to people around you -Contagious: You can be contagious two days before symptoms appear (or two days before test date if positive and no symptoms) through the end of the isolation period. —**MDHHS**
- Globally, the number of weekly COVID-19 cases has increased for the third consecutive week, after a declining trend was observed since the last peak in March 2022. During the week of 20 to 26 June 2022, over 4.1 million cases were reported, an 18% increase as compared to the previous week . —**WHO**
