SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- In the US, there were 410,000 to 740,000 flu hospitalizations during the 2019-2020 flu season, which ran from October to April, according to the CDC. It is anticipated that a fairly long period of heightened disease activity would lead to hundreds of thousands of patients already filling up rooms and overwhelm the hospitals, as there would be less room for COVID-19 patients.
- Oakland, Wayne, Macomb Counties and the City of Detroit issued joint emergency orders to close all publicly licensed pools. For Wayne County, this is listed under Public Health Order [2020-03](#). The joint orders are issued under the Michigan Public Health Code to safeguard Southeast Michigan residents from the possible spread of the disease. Pool operators will be required to continue scheduled maintenance.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-106](#), which extends the deadline for Michigan residents to pay back taxes and avoid foreclosure on their property during the ongoing coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic to June 29, 2020.
- Governor Whitmer sent a [letter](#) to President Trump requesting an extension of Title 32 authority in order to use Michigan National Guard forces to combat the spread of COVID-19 through July 31, 2020. Title 32 status, which provides for federal pay and benefits, is currently authorized by the President through June 24.
- Utilities, including the state's two largest Consumers Energy and DTE Energy, have extended protections for vulnerable customers through June 12, 2020, following Governor Whitmer's [extension of her Stay Safer at Home order](#) through that date.
- To make life easier on families who need to stay home during the pandemic, Michigan families who participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) soon will be able to buy their food online from two national retailers. In addition, the state is also rolling out "quarantine care kits" with essential goods for families with low and moderate incomes who are in quarantine or isolation.
- Secretary of State branch offices will reopen June 1st by appointment only for essential transactions not available online in order to continue to balance the need to provide critical services and protect public health.
