SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- In an effort to prevent a second wave of infections from spreading throughout Australia, the city of Melbourne has been placed under a six week lockdown due to a recent increase of daily confirmed cases. Residents are not allowed to leave their homes unless it's for grocery shopping, caregiving, exercise or work.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-144](#) which extends protections for Michigan residents who have had water service shut off ensuring families in Michigan have access to clean water for hand washing and sanitation. The order remains in effect until December 31, 2020 at 11:59 p.m.
- A rapid surge of new cases has caused at least 42 hospitals in Florida to reach their maximum capacity for intensive care unit beds.
- Dr. Deborah Birx has recommended states that are experiencing surges should return to "Phase One" of the White House's [original recommendations](#), by decreasing gatherings to 10 people or less.
- New York Governor Andrew Cuomo has announced that a decision for reopening schools in New York will be made on August 1-7, 2020.
- Researchers at University College London (UCL) conducted a [study](#) that revealed COVID-19 could cause neurological complications including stroke, nerve damage, and potentially fatal brain inflammation—even if the patients didn't show severe respiratory symptoms. The study took place from April to May and it comprised of 43 patients between the ages of 16 to 85 with mild to severe symptoms. Results reflected 10 cases of "temporary brain dysfunction" and delirium; 12 cases of brain inflammation; 8 cases of strokes; and 8 cases of nerve damage. Researchers are still trying to figure out why COVID-19 patients are developing these brain complications and follow-up studies will be necessary to understand the potential long-term neurological consequences of the pandemic.
