SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Nearly 108 million people in China's Jilin province could be forced back into lockdown after a second wave of COVID-19 infections triggered a backslide in the nation's push to return to normal. The abrupt reversal in China's northeast region has once again cut off public transportation, closed schools and led to another round of quarantine.
- As large parts of the U.S. ease their lockdowns against the coronavirus, public health officials in some states are being accused of bungling infection statistics or even deliberately using a little sleight of hand to make things look better than they are. The result is that politicians, business owners and ordinary Americans who are making decisions about reopenings and other day-to-day matters risk being left with the impression that the virus is under more control than it actually is.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-95](#), which extends and further enhances protections for the health and safety of residents and employees of long-term care facilities.
- Farm operations across the state are working so they can safely open and operate in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) outlined key [protocols](#) that U-pick operations should be implementing to protect themselves and their customers.
- The IRS and the U.S. Treasury Department will begin sending economic stimulus payments on preloaded debit cards this week, as reported by the Trump administration.
- Delta Air Lines will reportedly offer voluntary separations and early retirements to reduce its workforce as the company grapples with the coronavirus pandemic and its significant impacts on the airline industry.
