SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Less than two weeks ago, Michigan was moved from “medium” to “high” risk for COVID-19 by COVID Act Now. The group of technologists, epidemiologists, health experts and public policy leaders at COVID Act Now are identifying each state’s risk level for the spread of COVID-19 -- which have been rapidly worsening as COVID-19 cases increase throughout the U.S.
- Eighty-five infants who are under the age of 1 have tested positive for the coronavirus in Nueces County since testing began there in March, county officials confirmed. "Nueces County has been aggressive in testing the family members of those infected, especially those who work or live in high-risk situations: senior care centers, jails, group homes and halfway houses, and meatpacking plants," Nueces County Judge Barbara Canales said in a statement. "By contact tracing and testing the immediate family members for those with known exposure who work in high-risk critical infrastructure jobs, this may account for our higher degree of testing and positive test results among infants."
- A COVID-19 vaccine being developed by Oxford University and the drug giant AstraZeneca generated an immune response in a [study](#) of roughly 1,000 patients, according to interim results published early this week. The data, published in the medical journal, The Lancet, also show that the vaccine caused side effects, including fever, headaches, muscle aches, and injection site reactions, in about 60% of patients. All of the side effects were deemed mild or moderate, and all resolved themselves over the course of the study.
- As Michigan's fight against COVID-19 continues, school districts are preparing for the impending school year and, unless the state's cases start to trend in the opposite direction, West Bloomfield School District is planning to split students into two groups with three days of remote learning and two days in school. The school district announced the plan for the upcoming school year, which they have been working on since mid-May.
- Congresswoman Debbie Dingell announced that several hospitals in Southeast Michigan are getting millions of dollars in COVID-19 relief funding. The \$29.5 million is coming from the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the payments are from the COVID-19 High-Impact Allocation from the Provider Relief Fund.
