SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- During a Senate hearing Tuesday, Dr. Anthony Fauci, Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, warned that the number of new infections in the United States could more than double to 100,000 a day if the country fails to contain the surge that is now underway in many states. "We are now having 40-plus thousand new cases a day," Dr. Fauci said. "I would not be surprised if we go up to 100,000 a day if this does not turn around. And so I am very concerned."
- Governor Gretchen Whitmer, Senate Majority Leader Mike Shirkey, and House Speaker Lee Chatfield reached a bipartisan [FY 2020 Budget Agreement](#) that provides crucial funding for Michigan families, schools, and communities grappling with costs incurred as a result of the virus.
- Governor Gretchen Whitmer released the [MI Safe Schools Return to School Roadmap](#), a comprehensive document to help districts create local plans for in-person learning in the fall. The Roadmap outlines a number of safety protocols for schools to implement in each phase of the governor's MI Safe Start Plan.
- The governor also signed the following Executive Orders:
 - [2020-140](#): Work permits required by the Youth Employment Standards Act can be mailed, emailed, faxed or sent via the web rather than the previously required in-person submission.
 - [2020-141](#): Allows notice of any public hearing required to take place under a tax abatement statute may be provided electronically and by newspaper.
 - [2020-142](#): Provides a structure to support all schools in Michigan as they plan for a return of PreK-12 education in the fall.
- The European Union (EU) formally agreed on a set of recommendations that will allow travelers to visit EU countries. Unfortunately, the US does not meet the criteria set by the EU to be considered a "safe country" due to the currently high COVID-19 infection rate. According to the latest data from Johns Hopkins University, the US has the highest number of reported COVID-19 cases and deaths of any nation.
