SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Sinovac Biotech announced preliminary study results showing its experimental COVID-19 vaccine generated immune responses in patients and was safe — early data suggests it might protect people against COVID-19. The Beijing-based drug maker's vaccine, called CoronaVac, induced neutralizing antibodies in "above 90%" of people who were tested 14 days after receiving two injections, two weeks apart. The company also stated that there were no severe side effects reported.
- The University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) is expected to be the only site in Chicago selected to launch the Moderna phase 3 trial on July 9, which is being administered by the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease. According to Novak, a UIC professor and head of infectious diseases at the College of Medicine, "the clinical trial network hopes to enroll up to 30,000 individuals into the trial. About 1,000 individuals initially will be enrolled through UIC's trial. Novak said investigators will screen volunteers for the trial to ensure that 40% or more of participants are 65 years and older."
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-125](#), which clarifies Workers' Disability Compensation Act (WDCA) eligibility during the COVID-19 emergency, replacing emergency rules issued by the Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity in March 2020. Under this executive order, individuals who work within the secured borders of a penal institution, including correctional officers, medical staff, and cafeteria staff who serve prisoners will be presumptively entitled to worker's compensation if they suffer a personal injury as a result of COVID-19.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-126](#), which extends existing safety measures to protect consumers and employees at grocery stores and pharmacies.
- Governor Whitmer announced that Michigan schools may resume in-person learning in phase 4 of the MI Safe Start plan, with strict safety measures in place. The governor also announced that on June 30th, she will release an executive order and a robust document called "Michigan's Return to School Roadmap" that will provide details on what will be required and what will be recommended for schools. The governor also highlighted the need for support and flexibility from the federal government to help ensure resources for students and educators.
- Canada and the US have agreed to extend their agreement to keep their border closed to non-essential travel to July 21 during the coronavirus pandemic.
