### SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- COVID-19-related hospitalizations in at least nine states have been on the rise since Memorial Day, when a spate of large, crowded gatherings provoked warnings from health officials. Record numbers of patients requiring inpatient care have been reported in Arizona and Texas, which was one of the first states to ease stay-at-home orders.
- Moderna, has announced it will enter broad Phase 3 clinical trials for a COVID-19 vaccine this July, which could include as many as 30,000 human participants, according to Dr. Anthony Fauci, Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Disease. Other vaccine candidates, including those from Oxford University and AstraZeneca, Pfizer and Chinese vaccine developer Sinovac aren't far behind.
- Detroit Public Schools released a reopening plan for the September for the 2020-21 school year. Classrooms will be limited to 20 students at any one time, those riding the bus will need to sit apart, virtual alternatives will be offered in every session, and more electives might be offered to reduce class size. These, among other options, were packed into a 23-page [reopening draft](#) released by the Detroit Public Schools Community District on their [website](#).
- From Muskegon to Midland to Marquette, Michigan counties are securing and distributing COVID-19 emergency funding to veterans through the state's new County Veteran Service Fund Emergency Relief (CVSF-ER) program. To date, 12 counties have been approved for a total of nearly \$1.1 million in CVSF-ER funding, while eight other counties are close to securing another \$253,819 in the emergency relief assistance – for a working total of \$1.3 million.
- The COVID-19 pandemic and transition to remote and distance learning has only increased the need for residents and students to have easy access to broadband services. In response, the State of Michigan, in partnership with the Connected Nation Michigan, released a statewide [Wi-Fi hotspot map](#) to assist residents who currently lack internet access at home.
