SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- In its sprint to getting 70% of Americans vaccinated against the coronavirus by July 4, the Biden administration announced Thursday (June 3rd) a COVID-19 higher education challenge, which asks college and university leaders to pledge to doing as much as they can to get students, faculty and staff vaccinated before the start of the next academic. The announcement comes as the Biden administration's vaccination efforts increasingly focus on children and young adults to propel the country toward herd immunity and mark a major milestone in overcoming a once-in-a-generation pandemic.—**US News**
- The Biden administration outlined its plans for sharing at least 80 million surplus COVID-19 vaccine doses, saying it will distribute 75% of the allotment through COVAX, an international distribution system aimed at helping vaccinate people in the world's poorest countries. The first priority for doses shared through COVAX will be Latin America and the Caribbean; South and Southeast Asia; and Africa, the White House said. One quarter of the 80 million doses will be allocated to countries in immediate need due to surges, to countries that neighbor the U.S. and to other countries that have requested immediate help.—**NPR**
- Governor Whitmer announced that U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo is awarding \$1.5 million in CARES Act Recovery Assistance grants from the Economic Development Administration (EDA) to help the state of Michigan respond to the coronavirus. “As we continue putting Michigan back to work, this \$1.5 million grant will stimulate our economy and create good-paying jobs,” said Governor Gretchen Whitmer. “Michigan is grateful to Biden Administration and Secretary Raimondo at the Department of Commerce for investing in our local communities and helping us build back better from the pandemic.”—**Michigan.gov**
