## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The US recorded 91,530 new COVID-19 infections on Election Day, adding to a series of staggering case numbers reported within just the past week. The country's five highest days of coronavirus cases have all been recorded since October 29, affirming experts' warnings another surge is well underway and will only get worse. The nationwide seven-day average of new daily cases now stands at about 86,363 -- more than double what it was on September 4, data from Johns Hopkins University show.—**CNN**
- Jackson Public Schools has suspended in-person learning for the remainder of the week of Nov. 2 after a staff member at the high school tested positive for COVID-19. The staff member was in the high school last week and was in contact with both students and staff, Superintendent Jeff Beal said. As a result, the district is quarantining 10 staff members and 30 students. Quarantined students will remain out of the building until Monday, Nov. 16.—**Mlive**
- An eighth grade Missouri boy died over the weekend of COVID-19 complications, becoming the state's, and one of the nation's, youngest deaths from the coronavirus. In a statement, the superintendent of Missouri's Washington School District, said that the family confirmed their 13-year-old son Peyton had passed away from complications of the virus.—**NBC News**
- Washtenaw County's Winter Warming Shelter programming has started early this year to allow for additional shelter options and key transitions for individuals experiencing homelessness amid the COVID-19 pandemic. Winter sheltering efforts began on Oct. 2nd as part of a community response to prevent the spread of COVID-19.—**Click on Detroit**
