## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- With a devastating second wave of the Spanish flu pandemic in 1918-20 and the second wave of the H1N1 epidemic in 2009-10, warnings are being sounded about a possible resurgence of COVID-19 cases with the relaxation of the lockdown rules.
- In a testimony delivered remotely before the U.S. House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, Governor Whitmer called on the federal government to help states like Michigan ensure and promote widespread testing for COVID-19. The governor also highlighted the aggressive action Michigan has taken in the fight against COVID-19, including the state's efforts to secure personal protective equipment for frontline workers, expand testing capacity and eligibility, and address health disparities in communities of color.
- Michigan is working to ensure that anyone who needs a COVID-19 test can get one. Governor Whitmer and the Michigan Department of Insurance and Financial Services (DIFS) are alerting Michiganders that diagnostic COVID-19 testing for those who meet testing criteria should be covered by most health insurance plans without any out-of-pocket cost. There are various ways that costs for the test may be covered, and resources are available to help answer questions.
- Doctors are fighting not only to save lives from COVID-19, but also to protect patients' brains. Although COVID-19 is best known for damaging the lungs, it also increases the risk of life-threatening brain injuries. The virus may invade the brain, and it can starve the brain of oxygen by damaging the lungs. To fight the infection, the immune system sometimes overreacts, battering the brain and other organs it normally protects.
- 23andMe is working with willing clients to see if genetics plays a role in COVID-19. Anjali Shastri with 23andMe says, "we are trying to really understand [patients'] experience with COVID-19 and so we're hoping to take all of that data and to be able to analyze that along with their genetics to see if maybe there is a contribution of genetics of who falls in one category or another in terms of severity."
