SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- More than 30 states are reporting an increase in confirmed COVID-19 cases in the midst of the reopening of businesses and public facilities. In addition, 12 states are reporting an increase in hospitalization rates. Experts say the behavior of individuals as communities reopen is a major factor in whether COVID-19 cases continue to rise. Dr. Anthony Fauci told stated that if the current trend continues the United States could eventually see 100,000 new COVID-19 cases per day.
- Several U.S. states reported new record-breaking coronavirus case counts over the weekend as the nationwide death toll from COVID-19 surpassed 140,000. States such as Florida, California and Kentucky were reporting record or near-record numbers of new cases, and in Texas a hospital official stated that funeral homes and morgues were overflowing from the bodies of COVID-19 victims.
- Seventy-five countries have submitted expressions of interest to protect their populations through joining the COVAX Facility, a mechanism designed to guarantee rapid, fair and equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines worldwide. "COVAX is the only truly global solution to the COVID-19 pandemic," said Dr. Seth Berkley, CEO of Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance. "For the vast majority of countries, whether they can afford to pay for their own doses or require assistance, it means receiving a guaranteed share of doses."
- President Donald Trump held a White House coronavirus task force news for the first time since April. The task force has held news briefings since then, but President Trump has not participated in them. Trump's resumption of the coronavirus task force news briefings comes as COVID-19 cases are spiking across the country.
- A judge has ruled the in-person summer school classes can continue in the Detroit Public Schools Community District (DPSCD). While the judge has decided that the classes can continue, all of the students attending those classes need to have COVID-19 tests in the next two days or the in-person learning could be shut down.
