## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- As Florida emerges from its coronavirus shutdown, the state is experiencing a surge of COVID-19 cases, with younger Floridians accounting for a significant number of positive tests. The Florida Department of Health reported an additional 3,286 cases of coronavirus on Tuesday, bringing the state total to 103,503. Medical experts and elected officials have attributed the rising numbers to a combination of more testing and more social contact as businesses reopen and, in recent weeks, to people's participation in large protests, although that has not been clearly established.
- After Moderna recently announced the finalization of the Phase 3 study protocol of its vaccine (mRNA-1273), Dr. Anthony Fauci, director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, said he expected 100 million COVID-19 vaccine doses by early 2021.
- After U.S. District Judge Paul Maloney's ruling last week, gyms were scheduled to reopen today, June 25. However, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit ruled Michigan gyms must remain closed.
- New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut issued a joint travel advisory, requiring travelers from states with high COVID-19 infection rates to quarantine for 14 days. Currently involving the following states: Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, Florida, S. Carolina, N. Carolina, Utah, Texas, and Washington.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-131](#), which extends a previous executive order temporarily allowing e-signatures on official documents and remote notarizations to avoid unnecessary in-person contact during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Executive Order 2020-131 expires on July 31, 2020.
- The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has updated its reporting format to separate both confirmed and probable numbers of COVID-19 cases and deaths. Reported information on this Situation Report for Michigan cases and deaths is a total of the confirmed and probable values in MDHHS. Data specifics can found [here](#).

## ACTIONS TAKEN

- The Wayne Co. Dept. of Public Health has partnered with Garden City Hospital in the development of the [Save-A-Life](#) program to provide COVID-19 drive-up diagnostic and antibody testing for Wayne County employees, Wayne County residents, and the general public with no out-of-pocket cost or pre-scheduled appointment. The program also simplifies the donation of convalescent plasma for individuals with positive antibodies that wish to donate.
