## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- The CDC guidelines have been updated to now say that anyone who has previously suffered an immediate allergic reaction of any severity to any ingredient of Pfizer or Moderna's vaccines should not be vaccinated unless they have been cleared by doctors. One ingredient that is being carefully examined is called polyethylene glycol. It's a compound that's used to stabilize and transport bubble for the messenger RNA in the vaccines. It has never been used in a vaccine before, but it is an ingredient in many drugs. The CDC also said anyone with an allergy to polysorbate should not get the vaccines. —**Click on Detroit**
- UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson reimposed a lockdown in England on Monday (Jan. 4), as a more transmissible variant of COVID-19 fuels a surge in infections and hospitalizations in the country. "It is clear that we need to do more to bring this new variant under control," Johnson said. "That means the government is once again instructing you to stay at home." —**CNN World**
- Experts warned holiday travels and gatherings could help fuel another surge of COVID-19 infections. More than 1.3 million travelers—a pandemic record— have screened by the TSA on Sunday (Jan. 3) alone. Hospitalizations hit another grim record Monday (Jan. 4), with more than 128,200 COVID-19 patients, according to the [COVID Tracking Project](#). But some states are warning the worst may be yet ahead. —**CNN Health**
- Free KN95 masks provided by MDHHS will be distributed by community organizations, including local MDHSS offices, health departments and Area Agency on Aging offices. "We are urging Michiganders to Mask Up and Mask Right to protect themselves, their loved ones and their communities from COVID-19," said MDHHS Director Robert Gordon. —**Michigan.gov**
