## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- A Mississippi teacher who was under self-quarantine with symptoms of COVID-19 died this week — stoking fears that the district could see an outbreak of the contagion as students return to classrooms. Nacoma James, 42, who taught at Lafayette Middle School and was an assistant football coach for the district's high school, died on Thursday, said district superintendent Adam Pugh. In-person classes were back in session across the district this week for the first time since March. James did not return to the classroom but had contact with students during football workouts "all summer," Pugh said.
- Nearly 100,000 children in the United States tested positive for COVID-19 in the last two weeks of July according to a new report from the American Academy of Pediatrics. Just over 97,000 children tested positive for COVID-19 from July 16 to July 30, according to the association. More than 25 children died from COVID-19 in July alone. Health officials across the country are urging school districts to make the transition to remote learning in order to protect staff and students despite pressures of reopening.
- Melissa Martinez, a kindergarten teacher in the San Antonio Independent School District has died Wednesday morning due to complications from COVID-19 according to district officials. She was last on campus during the first week of June. She had just completed her sixth year with the district. Martinez's passing is at least the third death of San Antonio-area educators due to COVID-19.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following Executive Orders:
  - [2020-165](#): Extends the governor's emergency and disaster declaration until September 4th.
  - [2020-166](#): Reinstates protections for Michigan workers as the state continues to fight the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - [2020-167](#): Creates the Food Security Council within the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services.
