SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- On Wednesday, Wayne County (not including Detroit) recorded 203 new cases. That number is more than double the 7-day rolling daily average for the county. These numbers continue to show that COVID-19 remains at the "community spread" contagion level. The Wayne County Public Health Division epidemiologists continue to conduct contact tracing for all new cases. Of the 203 new cases, health officials report the following commonalities:
 - Dearborn:** Of the 61 cases, 13 are from 6 different household (5 households consisted of pairs of 2 each with shared addresses; one was a group of three with the same address).
 - Hamtramck:** Of the 12 cases, 3 were from the same household.
 - Redford:** Of the 3 cases, 2 were from the same household.
 - Southgate:** Of the 7 cases, 3 were from the same household.
 - Taylor:** Of the 7 cases, 2 were from the same household.
- The Wayne County Public Health Division, in partnership with the City of Detroit Health Department, Wayne Regional Educational Service Agency and participating Wayne County school district superintendents, developed a [comprehensive roadmap](#) for school administrators, faculty and staff to help them get back to school safely. The workgroup aligned the guidance with the State of Michigan's [MI Safe Start Plan](#). This roadmap is not an order, but strongly recommended guidance, complete with letter templates and other tools to clearly communicate with school communities. This document will evolve as the workgroup continues to meet to refine guidance in accordance with State of Michigan orders and provide ongoing support to Wayne County schools throughout the Pandemic.
- New Jersey's largest teachers' union and several organizations representing principals and administrators have issued a joint statement calling for all-remote learning for the new school year. Leaders from the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, the New Jersey Principals and Supervisors Association and the New Jersey Education Association, put out the following statement: "For months, New Jersey educators and administrators have been working tirelessly to find a way to safely bring students back into school buildings in September," the statement reads. "Now, with less than a month remaining before schools are scheduled to reopen, it is time to reluctantly acknowledge that goal is simply not achievable."
