SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- As restaurants and bars in southern and central Michigan reopen, most Michigan residents are worried about a second wave of the coronavirus and satisfied with the pace at which Governor Whitmer is restarting the economy, according to a new poll commissioned by the Free Press. On the possibility of a second wave of the coronavirus in Michigan, 68% said they were concerned and 57% said Michigan should wait to reopen the economy to shorten the public health crisis.
- The US government's current supply of Remdesivir, the only drug known to work against COVID-19, will run out at the end of the month, Dr. Robert Kadlec, a US Department of Health and Human Services official, told CNN. The government's last shipment of the drug will go out the week of June 29. Gilead Sciences, the company that makes the drug, is ramping up to make more, but it's unclear how much will be available this summer.
- In an effort to provide more information about COVID-19 in Michigan, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) is providing additional and improved statistics on its [website](#). The following information is being included:
 - Confirmed and probable cases and deaths by age group, sex and race breakdowns for the state, preparedness regions and counties.
 - Total serologic and diagnostic tests by county and preparedness region.
 - Cumulative confirmed cases and deaths by date.
- Approximately 350,000 Michigan families will continue to have access to additional food assistance benefits during the month of June as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Whitmer and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) announced today. Michigan previously approved the additional food assistance for March, April and May – and now that is being extended for the month of June with approval from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service.
- New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern says the country has officially eradicated COVID-19 and will return to normal after the last known infected person recovered. Isolation and quarantine for those arriving from abroad will continue.
