# **SITUATIONAL AWARENESS**

- President Joe Biden announced a series of measures on Tuesday (Jan. 26) aimed at ramping up coronavirus vaccine allocation and distribution, including the purchase of 200 million more vaccine doses and increased distribution to states by millions of doses next week.
   With those additional doses, Biden said there would be enough to fully vaccinate 300 million Americans -- nearly the entire US population -- by the end of summer or early fall.—CNN
- Michigan's six most-populated counties -- and eight of the 10 largest -- are now below a 7% positivity rate as a seven-day average on coronavirus diagnostic tests. Those below 7% include Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Kent, Genesee, Washtenaw, Ottawa and Kalamazoo. The two exceptions among the 10 most-populated counties: Ingham is at 7.5% and Saginaw is at 7.3%. Statewide, the seven-day average positivity rate is 6.3%, down from 6.5% a week ago. The statewide seven-day average of new cases is now 1,777, down from 2,072 from last week.—Mlive
- CDC officials said Tuesday (Jan. 26) that restrictions requiring travelers to test negative for COVID-19 before flying domestically in the U.S. are being seriously considered. It is reported that the agency is "actively looking" at tightening restrictions amid new variants of the COVID-19 virus spreading in parts of the world and now being reported in the U.S. Types and locations of testing might be are actively being looked at.—The Hill
