SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- As South Korea eased some social distancing restrictions and prepared to fully reopen schools and businesses, fears of a second wave emerged after the Korea Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (KCDC) reported 69 new cases in 48 hours—the equivalent of the amount the country had recorded the entire previous week. Most of the new cases have been linked to several bars and nightclubs.
- Governor Whitmer has provided the following updates during her briefing:
 - The state has dispersed more than \$4 billion (USD) in unemployment benefits to more than 1.1 million unemployed workers.
 - Businesses cannot punish a worker who must stay home because they've tested positive for COVID-19, are experiencing symptoms, or come into contact with someone who has.
 - The department of corrections has taken a number of measures to protect people who are serving time by expanding testing protocols and expediting paroles.
 - Data and reports from state parks will continue to be monitored and social distancing guidelines must continue to be adhered within the parks.
 - Aggressive testing, contact tracing, and isolation will be the only way to get ahead of this disease since there is currently no vaccine for COVID-19.
 - The state has set a goal to ramp up testing by June from 15,000 tests per day to 30,000.
- Governor Whitmer signed the following Executive Orders:
 - [2020-79](#): Lifts certain requirements of the application process for young Michiganders to obtain a work permit. This order is effective immediately and remains in effect through 6/8/2020.
 - [2020-80](#): Continues to allow certain state administrative hearings to be held by video conference or phone in place of in-person hearings. This order is effective immediately and remains in effect through 6/8/2020.
 - [2020-81](#): Continues to temporarily lift weight and other delivery-related restrictions for vehicles carrying essential supplies. This order remains in effect through 5/25/2020.
