SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- White House Coronavirus Task Force coordinator Dr. Deborah Birx visited Michigan Wednesday to discuss the state's response to COVID-19. Dr. Birx met with Governor Whitmer to discuss how the COVID-19 has swept across our country and state this summer. She said the numbers are overall down here in Michigan, but the state is not out of the woods yet. Dr. Brix had given the following warning:

“What we now learn is you can't tell if a person has (COVID-19). Frankly, that person themselves may be so asymptomatic that they don't know they have it. So let's over this Labor Day weekend really protect one another. Be safe like you have been this summer.”

- Pfizer could have results from its late-stage coronavirus vaccine trial as early as October, CEO Albert Bourla said. The pharmaceutical company has already enrolled 23,000 volunteers in the phase three trial that began in late July. It hopes to enroll at least 30,000 participants. “We expect by the end of October, we should have enough ... to say whether the product works or not,” Bourla said.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-176](#) reopening Michigan's gyms and pools in those regions where they remain closed and allowing for organized sports practices and competitions to resume in those regions where they remain restricted, subject to [strict protections](#) meant to limit spread of the virus. Gyms and pools may begin to reopen on Wednesday, September 9. The governor also signed Executive Order [2020-175](#) outlining strict workplace safety measures gyms and pools must follow to protect people from the spread of COVID-19.
- Governor Whitmer took further action to protect the health and safety of Michiganders by extending the State of Emergency until October 1, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. Executive Order [2020-177](#) will allow the state to continue to mobilize resources and take the reasonable and necessary steps to protect Michiganders and their families.
