# **SITUATIONAL AWARENESS**

- The FDA says that some of the vials of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine being distributed throughout the U.S. contain extra doses and the agency is encouraging hospitals and clinics to use the additional shots to speed up the nationwide immunization campaign. "At this time, given the public health emergency, FDA is advising that it is acceptable to use every full dose obtainable (the sixth, or possibly even a seventh) from each vial, pending resolution of the issue," the FDA reported.—NPR
- The State of Michigan has launched a new COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard launched on Monday (Dec. 14) to help Michiganders track information about the vaccine. According to the dashboard, the state has 297 sites enrolled in the vaccine provider program, and 26,325 vaccine doses have been shipped to site so far, according to the dashboard. All those 26,000-doses have gone to hospitals, which are immunizing front-line health-care workers.—mLive
- MDHHS and Michigan Department of Technology, Management & Budget (DTMB) announced there have been 461,192 downloads of MI COVID Alert. The state also rolled out a second option for users to receive the PIN required to anonymously share a positive COVID-19 test result. Even when just 15% of a population used an exposure notification app like MI COVID Alert, researchers from Oxford University found a potential to reduce infections and deaths. Already, nearly 9% of Michigan residents ages 18 to 64 have downloaded MI COVID Alert.— Michigan.gov
- Approximately 350,000 Michigan families will continue to have access to additional food
  assistance benefits during December as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor
  Whitmer and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) announced.—
