## SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

- Epidemiologists say Michigan is all but assured to experience a second wave of COVID-19 infections later this year, but the severity of another surge in cases depends on the behavior of people re-entering society. Michigan residents can venture into public spaces and businesses after Governor Whitmer lifted her eight-week-long quarantine order and moved northern regions of the state into the penultimate phase of her recovery plan. Public health experts project COVID-19 to spread at a slower rate throughout the summer, but much remains unknown about how the highly contagious respiratory virus could flare up in colder months.
- For the second time, Arizona is activating its hospital emergency plan as cases of COVID-19 continue to increase in the state following implementation of their reopening plan. Arizona was one of the earliest states to begin reopening, but since Governor Ducey's stay-at-home order expired on May 15, COVID-19 cases have soared 110 percent - more than doubling to 27,678, as of Monday. The governor said last week that an increase in cases was due to an increase in testing. But ICU and ventilator use are rising in state hospitals.
- Vaccines in development around the world are in various stages of testing. Dr. Anthony Fauci said he's confident one of the vaccine candidates will be proven safe and effective by the first quarter of 2021. It's not clear which candidate shows the greatest promise yet. In the meantime, the US government is helping companies such as Moderna ramp up development of their candidate vaccines so that if they're proven to work safely, they can be rolled out quickly.
- Governor Whitmer signed Executive Order [2020-117](#), which continues expanded access and capacity for child care services, giving priority to essential workforces. The Executive Order takes effect immediately and continues through July 7, 2020.
- With rate filings representing more than 99.5% of Michigan's personal auto insurance market now approved, Governor Whitmer and the Michigan Department of Insurance and Financial Services (DIFS) announced that the average statewide Personal Injury Protection (PIP) medical savings under the state's new auto insurance law will exceed the law's requirements. The new law also strengthens consumer protections and mandates statewide average savings for 8 years.
